The Box Butte County Fair Shoot is open to Shooting Sports members who have been in a club with a certified instructor and have attended safety sessions and practice shoots. Fair pre-registration forms must be in the Extension Office by July 11, 2008.

All firearms will be inspected prior to the shoot by judges who will have the final say on all questionable firearms. Unsafe firearms will be disqualified, not the 4-H member. 4-Hers will be allowed to borrow another firearm. Pickup time will be announced on fair day.

Shooting Sports instructors will have the authority to set safety rules and regulations the day of the shoot and may disqualify any participant who endangers the safety of their fellow shooters or spectators.

Dress Code. To shoot at the Box Butte County Fair, 4-H Shooting Sports members are required to wear:

- a. Blue Jeans
- b. White shirt with collar
- c. 4-H chevron attached to the left front of the shirt
- d. Appropriate shoes
- e. Eye protection is mandatory

Total Shots

Competition BB Gun will be held in accordance with NRA 5 meter BB Gun rules most recent addition. Target range will be 5 meters. Equipment and guns must meet NRA requirements (aperture sights allowed). Telescopic sights will not be allowed. The course of fire will be four positions (standing, sitting, kneeling and prone), 10 shots each position, for a total of 40 shots. The target will be a standard 5 meter BB gun target.

BB – purple 300-400
blue 200-299
red 1-199

Competition Air Rifle will be held in accordance with NRA 10 meter sporter air rifle rules most recent edition. Target

Range will be 10 meters. Equipment and guns must meet NRA requirements (aperture sights allowed). The course of fire will be 3 positions (standing, sitting and prone). 10 shots each position, for a total of 30 shots. The target will be a standard 10 meter air rifle target.

Air Rifle - purple 200-300
blue 150-199
red 1-149

Due to the uniqueness of the sport, blue and red ribbons may be awarded medals.

The competition BB Gun and Sporter Air Rifle shoot will be held Sunday, August 5 at the fairgrounds Multi-Purpose Hall. Check-in will be at 6:30 p.m. with the competition starting at 7:00 p.m.

Age divisions are determined by the 4-H age as of January 1, 2008.
